Quick Facts about Team CHL, & 2025 CHL USA Prospects Challenge

- Both games of the 2025 CHL USA Prospects Challenge will be broadcast live on TSN and RDS at 6:00 p.m. MT / 8:00 p.m. ET, with matchups set for November 25 in Calgary and November 26 in Lethbridge. Tickets are on sale now at CHL.ca/ProspectsChallenge.
- All 15 CHL players who received an "A" rating from NHL Central Scouting <u>identifying</u> them as projected first-round candidates for the 2026 NHL Draft — have been named to Team CHL's roster.
- Seven CHL players who earned a "B" rating from NHL Central Scouting <u>identifying</u> them as projected second- or third-round candidates for the 2026 NHL Draft — have been named to Team CHL's roster.
- This year's roster features 22 of the league's top prospects, including 10 players from the OHL, eight from the WHL, and four from the QMJHL.
- The roster includes five American-born players, headlined by Nikita Klepov (Windsor Spitfires) and Brooks Rogowski (Oshawa Generals), who captured gold with Team USA at the 2025 Hlinka Gretzky Cup.
- Eight additional players represented Canada at that same tournament, earning bronze medals: Ethan Belchetz, Carson Carels, Alessandro Di Iorio, Beckham Edwards, Ryan Lin, Giorgos Pantelas, Mathis Preston, and Daxon Rudolph.
- Six Team CHL players Carels, Di Iorio, Lin, Roobroeck, Rudolph, and Villeneuve helped Canada capture gold at the 2025 IIHF U18 World Championship, bringing championship pedigree and big-game experience to this year's lineup.
- Another six players Lin, Pantelas, Rudolph, Belchetz, Preston, and Edwards also struck gold with Canada at the 2024 World U17 Hockey Challenge, underscoring the team's depth of proven winners on the international stage.
- Two players on Team CHL hail from outside North America: Czech forward Adam Novotný (Prince Albert Raiders) and Russian centre Yegor Shilov (Victoriaville Tigres).
- Six players are competing in their first CHL season Boettiger, Hurlbert, Klepov, Malhotra, Novotný, and Shilov — each making an early impression as top prospects in their draft class.
- In total, 19 CHL clubs are represented on the roster, including three teams featuring a pair of teammates: the Spokane Chiefs (*Preston & Harrington*), Sarnia Sting (*Di Iorio & Edwards*), and Québec Remparts (*Dagenais & Morrison*).
- The inaugural CHL USA Prospects Challenge, held in November 2024 in London and Oshawa, Ontario, proved to be a landmark event in showcasing the next wave of elite NHL talent.
 - Of the 22 players who suited up for Team CHL, an impressive 16 were selected in the first round of the 2025 NHL Draft — meaning half of the opening round competed in these games. The result underscores the CHL USA Prospects Challenge's emergence as a premier showcase for the game's top draft-eligible talent.
 - Five Team CHL alumni Matthew Schaefer (Erie / 1st overall, NYI), Michael Misa (Saginaw / 2nd, SJS), Brady Martin (Soo / 5th, NSH), Ben Kindel (Calgary / 11th, PIT), and Braeden Cootes (Seattle / 15th, VAN) — have already made their NHL debuts during the 2025–26 season.
- Team CHL captured the inaugural CHL USA Prospects Challenge (November 2024), sweeping the two-game series 2−0 after a 6−1 win in London and a dramatic 3−2 victory in Oshawa, sealed by the game-winning goal from Calgary Flames prospect Cole









Reschny (Victoria Royals / WHL) with 72 seconds remaining in regulation against the U.S. National Under-18 Team.

CHL Representation on NHL Central Scouting's 2025 Preliminary Players to Watch List

- The CHL led all development leagues worldwide with 232 North American players (73.4%) named to the 2025 list up from 155 (57.0%) in 2024.
- This represents a 49.6% year-over-year increase (+77 players) and a 16-point rise in overall representation.
- All three CHL Member Leagues saw double-digit gains:
 - o **OHL:** 91 players (+29 / +46.8% vs. 2024)
 - WHL: 86 players (+31 / +56.4% vs. 2024)
 - QMJHL: 55 players (+17 / +44.7% vs. 2024)
- The 232 CHL players named mark the highest total in at least 12 years and likely in league history surpassing previous highs of 162 (2016) and 161 (2023).
- Each league also set or matched modern-era records for representation:
 - o **OHL:** 91 players (previous high: 76 in 2016)
 - o WHL: 86 players (previous high: 63 in 2023)
 - o **QMJHL:** 55 players (previous high: 38 in 2024)
- Collectively, 2025 stands as the strongest year on record for CHL representation on NHL Central Scouting's preliminary rankings.

CHL to the NHL: Draft Success and Alumni Impact

- The CHL's dominance on NHL Draft day continues to stand unmatched among global development leagues.
- Following Matthew Schaefer's first-overall selection in 2025, a total of 42 CHL players have been chosen No. 1 overall in the 57 NHL Drafts since 1969 accounting for nearly 75% of all top picks in that span.
- The CHL has produced at least 10 first-round selections in every NHL Draft since 1969, marking an unbroken streak of 56 consecutive years.
- In NHL Draft history, a single league has generated 20 or more first-rounders nine times
 all belonging to the CHL, including 21 first-round picks in 2025.
- Since 1969, 6,117 CHL players have been drafted into the NHL, representing approximately 47% of all drafted players in that period.
- During the 2024–25 NHL season, more than 415 players who appeared in at least one NHL game developed in the WHL, OHL, or QMJHL.
- As the NHL opened its 2025–26 season, a total of 402 Canadian Hockey League (CHL) alumni spanning the WHL, OHL, and QMJHL were featured on NHL Opening Night rosters, accounting for nearly 50% of all players in the league.
- Entering the 2025–26 NHL season, 18 CHL alumni wore the captain's "C" for their respective NHL clubs.
- 22 of the NHL's 32 head coaches either played or coached in the CHL, reinforcing the league's role as a breeding ground for future hockey leaders.
- More than 200 CHL alumni currently serve in coaching, hockey operations, or support roles across the NHL — with at least one graduate on every team.
- That total represents the largest single source of NHL talent in the world, underscoring the CHL's enduring position as the premier pathway to the NHL.

Quick Bio: Boettiger (Wheat Ridge, CO) is a 6'2", 186-pound goaltender for the Kelowna Rockets (WHL) and a top American prospect for the 2026 NHL Draft. Acquired from Lethbridge in the Caden Price trade, he spent last season with the U.S. National Team Development Program, posting strong numbers in both the USHL and at the 2024 CHL/USA Prospects Challenge (.921 SV%). A silver medalist at the 2023 World U17 Challenge and bronze medalist at the 2024 IIHF U18 Worlds, Boettiger brings size, poise, and international experience to the crease.

- As of October 26, Boettiger has made four starts, recording two games with a save percentage above .930 while making at least 28 saves in each of those outings.
- Made his WHL debut on <u>October 10, 2025</u>, turning aside 28 of 30 shots in a 3-1 loss to the Seattle Thunderbirds at Prospera Place in Kelowna
- Signed by the Kelowna Rockets to a WHL Scholarship and Development Agreement in June 2025.
- Originally selected 4th overall by the Lethbridge Hurricanes in the 2022 WHL U.S. Priority Draft.
- Acquired by Kelowna in January 2025 as part of the Caden Price trade, which also brought in defenceman Will Sharpe and multiple draft picks.
- Spent the 2024–25 season with the U.S. National Team Development Program (NTDP), appearing for both the U17 and U18 squads.
- Posted a 3.61 GAA and .884 SV% in 24 games with the U18 team, including a strong USHL showing with a 2.79 GAA, .907 SV%, and 8 wins in 13 games.
- Started one game (Game 2 in Oshawa) for the U.S. National Under-18 Team at the 2024 CHL USA Prospects Challenge, making 35 saves with a 3.00 GAA and .921 SV%.
- Internationally, helped Team USA win silver at the 2023 World U17 Hockey Challenge and bronze at the 2024 IIHF U18 World Championship.
- Eligible for the 2026 NHL Draft, Boettiger is considered a key addition for the Rockets as they prepare to host the 2026 Memorial Cup at the end of the 2025–26 season.

Quick Bio: Jovanovski is a 6'2", 170-pound goaltender from Tecumseh, Ontario, and a 2023 seventh-round pick (134th overall) of the Guelph Storm. A former standout with Windsor Jr. Spitfires U18 AAA and Sun County Panthers AAA, he is one of just four North American goalies to earn a 'B' rating from NHL Central Scouting.

- Jovanovski is a 6'2", 170-pound goaltender from Tecumseh, Ontario, and a 2023 seventh-round pick (134th overall) of the Guelph Storm.
- Since October 18, Jovanovski has won three consecutive starts, highlighted by a 32-save effort in Owen Sound (Oct. 18) and a 34-save performance against the Ottawa 67's (Oct. 26).
- Jovanovski has recorded 28 or more saves in seven of his 10 starts during the 2024–25 season.
- Earned his first career OHL shutout during his rookie season in 2024–25, stopping all 39 shots he faced against the Owen Sound Attack on January 3, 2025.
- Made his OHL debut on <u>November 1, 2024</u>, stopping 12 shots in relief against the Ottawa 67's, before earning his first career start the following night (<u>Nov. 2</u>).
- Signed an OHL Scholarship and Development Agreement with Guelph in June 2024.
- Appeared in 19 games during the 2024–25 season, posting a 3.71 goals-against average, .886 save percentage, one shutout, and a 6-10-3-0 record, while also seeing time with the Ayr Centennials (GOJHL).

Quick Bio:

A steady, methodical defender known for clean puck handling and smart positioning. Carels was key to Canada's U18 World Championship gold earlier in 2025, and he logged a high-minute role on Prince George last season. His calm under pressure and reliability behind the puck earned him a spot on Team CHL's defensive depth chart.

Media Notes:

- As of October 27, Carson Carels sits tied for eighth in scoring among WHL defencemen this season, producing 11 points in 12 games during the 2025–26 campaign.
- Earned silver with Canada Red at the 2024 U17 World Challenge.
- Won gold with Canada at the 2025 U18 World Championship.
- Helped Manitoba win its first-ever gold medal at the 2023 WHL Cup.
- Made his WHL debut at the age of 15 on <u>December 13, 2023</u>, in a 5-2 loss at Everett
- Scored his first career WHL point in a two-assist effort in only his third career game on <u>December 15, 2023</u> – a 9-2 win at Vancouver.
- Played seven WHL regular-season games as a 15-year-old during the 2023-24 season.

Quick Bio:

Finishing his U17 season with 53 points, Lin is among the most productive young defencemen in CHL history. He earned attention as a puck-moving quarterback and breakout specialist—even at a younger age than his peers. Now a leader for Vancouver, he brings elite anticipation, smooth mobility, and creativity in transition to Team CHL's back end.

- As of October 27, Lin leads all WHL defencemen with 19 points in 2025-26, ranking third among CHL blueliners behind only Carson Woodall (Windsor) and Xavier Villeneuve (Blainville-Boisbriand), who each have 22 points.

- Won gold with Canada at the 2025 IIHF U18 World Championship May 3, 2025.
- Won gold with Canada White at the 2024 U17 World Challenge November 10, 2024.

Quick Bio: A 6'2", 193-pound defenceman from Miramichi, New Brunswick, Charlie Morrison was selected 28th overall by the Québec Remparts in the 2024 QMJHL Draft. A strong-skating blueliner with a good stick who processes the game well, he's eager to jump in and support the rush while showing quality puck skills and a reliable first pass. Morrison impressed as a rookie in 2024–25 and previously starred with Champions Hockey Academy, earning CSSHL Eastern U17 Top Defenceman honours. He received a "B" rating from NHL Central Scouting in October 2025.


- Morrison has yet to appear in a game during the 2025–26 season.

Quick Bio:

A 6-foot-2, 211-pound right-shot defenceman from Victoria, B.C., Pantelas was selected 19th overall by the Wheat Kings in the 2023 WHL Prospects Draft. A poised, two-way blueliner, he moves the puck efficiently, defends with confidence, and contributes on both special teams. Born in Montreal and raised in Victoria, he previously starred with the Rink Hockey Academy Kelowna U15, recording 38 points in 28 games. Pantelas won gold with Canada White at the 2024 U17 World Challenge and with Canada at the 2025 IIHF U18 World Championship.

Media Notes:

- Pantelas had recorded points in five straight games from October 5 to 18 before being held off the scoresheet in back-to-back contests during the 2025–26 season.
- Born in Montreal and lived there until 10 years of age before moving to Victoria, B.C.
- Played most of his WHL Draft year as a forward with Rink Hockey Academy in Kelowna before being selected 19th overall by the Brandon Wheat Kings.
- Won gold with Canada at the 2025 IIHF U18 World Championship.
- Won gold with Canada White at the 2024 U17 World Hockey Challenge.
- Made his WHL debut March 22, 2024, in a 3-2 win at Regina.
- Recorded his first WHL point on September 21, 2024, in a 5-1 win at Regina.

Quick Bio:

Born December 30, 2007, in Chesterfield, Michigan, Chase Reid was selected 125th overall (7th round, 2023) by the Soo Greyhounds. Now serving as an Alternate Captain in his sophomore OHL season, the poised right-shot defenceman has quickly emerged as one of the league's brightest young blueliners. A First All-Star Team and Rookie of the Month (Jan. 2025) honouree after a 40-point rookie campaign, Reid is lauded for his hockey IQ, skill, and calming presence.

Media Notes:

- Reid leads all first-year NHL Draft-eligible defencemen in the OHL with 14 points (2G-12A), ranking second only to Villeneuve (4G-18A-22 PTS) among that same group of blueliners across the CHL.
- Alternate Captain entering his sophomore OHL season in 2025-26.
- Made his OHL debut in 2024-25, quickly emerging as a standout young defenceman.
- Recorded 40 points (7G-33A) in 39 games as a rookie led all OHL rookies in assists.
- Earned a spot on the OHL's First All-Star Team following the 2024-25 campaign.
- Named the OHL's Rookie of the Month (January 2025) the first defencemen to earn the honour since Zayne Parekh (Dec. 2022).
- Recipient of the Greyhounds' "Rookie of the Year" award in 2024-25.
- Joined Sault Ste. Marie in December 2024 from the Bismarck Bobcats (NAHL), where he impressed with 12 points (6G-6A) in 18 games before making the jump to the OHL.
- In 2023-24, he appeared in 68 games with Victory Honda 16U AAA, recording 62 points (14G-48A), while also skating in 10 games with the Waterloo Black Hawks (USHL).
