



Core Standards for Billets

Core standards are described as the minimum standards required in order to be considered as a billet for the Lethbridge Hurricanes. While we appreciate your interest, your application will not be moved to the next level unless each core standard is met.

- 1. Billets must provide a private bedroom for each player they billet.**
 - “Private bedroom” is defined as an existing enclosed bedroom protected from other children in the house. Future or proposed bedrooms will not be considered.
 - The player must be provided with clean bedding and mattress.
 - The player must have closet and storage space.
- 2. Suitable bathroom facilities must be made available.**
 - Bathroom facilities must be accessible and reasonably private.
- 3. Billets must make available wholesome and nutritious food for their player including sufficient quantities of staples such as milk, cereals, fruits, vegetables, and protein.**
 - The billet cheque is designed to provide grocery money for your player. You will need to work with your player to ensure his needs are met in quantity and variety of food.
- 4. Your motivation for billeting must be to provide a home for a junior hockey player. Applications will be turned down if there is any indication this is not the reason for your interest.**
- 5. Billets are required to ensure team rules are followed in the homes. NO EXCEPTIONS.**
- 6. Billets are required to maintain a non-smoking air quality inside the home.**
 - This standard applies immediately to all new billet applications. Existing billets will work on a contingency basis with the coaching staff.
- 7. You must provide a clean and stable home atmosphere for your hockey player.**
 - Homes with teenage female residents are discouraged. These homes will be assessed on an individual basis and closely monitored by the coaching staff.
- 8. Evaluation and review.**
 - Billet homes may be reviewed at any time during the season by coaching staff or appointed representatives to ensure core standards are being met.
 - Billet homes will be reviewed annually by the billet liaison committee and may include home visits.
 - Billet homes will be reviewed mid-season and at the end of each season by the players through either verbal or written evaluations.
 - Families interested in billeting will be required to have a criminal record check.



LETHBRIDGE HURRICANES BILLET GUIDELINES

1. We encourage you to make Hurricanes players a part of your family and create a home environment for them. Treat them as one of your own and they will abide by your house rules.
2. Let the players know the rules of your house. **Do not** assume anything. What is unacceptable in your house may be acceptable in theirs.
3. The players should be respectful and helpful at all times but if they do anything you do not like please tell them! Please don't ignore small problems and we ask for open, honest communication between the player, the billets, the hockey team and the parents. It is essential to the core values of our organization. We need your assistance and would ask you to contact Ryan Aasman with your concerns. Please report any problems within 24-hours so they can be addressed before they become bigger issues.
4. It is mandatory that all players registered in school attend classes. The school has been asked to inform and/or call the Hurricanes office to report absences and late occurrences. We will deal with the issue but at the same time we will inform billets and in kind we ask you to inform the hockey club of any behaviour or habits you think are detrimental to the player and/or the team.
5. The players' curfew is **10:00PM on the evening before a game**, and 11:00PM at all other times. The players are to be home after curfew, **without friends, teammates, or partners visiting**. Curfew will be checked regularly by the coaches. It is compulsory that the players sleep at their own homes. Curfew calls will usually be made between 10:00-10:30PM. Internet access is to end at midnight every night or earlier at the discretion of the billet.
6. Players' partners and friends (in or out-of-town) **will not** be allowed to stay with the players at your home. Again, it is your home and you should not have to be put in any situation in which you are not comfortable. Players are also not allowed to leave your home after curfew.
7. If you are leaving town for a couple of days and the player will be on his own, **please notify Ryan Aasman**.
8. The local bars, casinos, and nightclubs are off limits to all players.

9. Absolutely NO smoking, tobacco chewing, or drugs will be tolerated.

10. Players **require permission** to go home to their hometowns (i.e. Calgary, Red Deer, etc.).

11. Meals should be wholesome and varied, but the players do not need to eat steak everyday. On game days, a player should eat between 1:00PM and 3:00PM for a 7:00PM game. If no one is home at this time, and the player is unable to prepare his own meal, we recommend a meal that can be made up in advance and reheated.

12. **Your first obligation is to the parents and the Hockey Club, not the player.** Please do not hide things from us, which may be hurting the player as a person or as a hockey player, and consequently hurting the team.

13. Communications regarding problems with your players or concerns over behaviour should be directed toward **Ryan Aasman**. Questions concerning tickets can be directed to **Dylan Thornborough** or **Kathy Hong**. Questions about billet payment can be answered by **Brenda Orsten**.

14. Keeping good communication lines open can only foster a strong relationship between the Hurricanes and their Billet families.

BILLET PAYMENTS:

Each Billet family will receive **\$450/player per month**. Each family will also receive **two (2)** tickets for pre-season, regular season, and playoffs for each game per billeted player. Along with the tickets you will have the opportunity to take advantage of all the special benefits of a regular season ticket holder (i.e. VIP Card, first chance at getting tickets to select VisitLethbridge.com Events).
