Wild/ICE All-Time Record vs. Spokane: 60-54-10-4 (2 ties) - 131st regular-season meeting

IN A NUTSHELL:

After snaring a win on the road last night, the Wild return to the TTC looking for a weekend sweep of an in-state rival.

THE SCENE-SETTER:

A handful of early-period goals, including a third-period table-turning, and a Wenatchee debut highlighted a 5-4 Wild victory Saturday at Numerica Veterans Arena. **Riley Bassen** made his WHL debut with a goal and an assist, with the latter coming on his opening shift, 59 seconds in - Bassen tossed the puck off Carter Esler's pads and **Blake Vanek** punched in the second chance for the early lead. Spokane erased it with a rebound goal on the doorstep from Chase Harrington at 12:52, but Wenatchee regained the lead at 3:02 of the second on **Zane Torre's** goal from a **Grady Wedman** pass. The Chiefs tied the game at 6:05 of the period when Coco Armstrong shoveled the puck past **Cal Conway**, and Logan Wormald scored 2-on-1 to take the lead just past the game's halfway point. Wenatchee's final three goals came in quick succession in the third - Bassen caromed in his first WHL goal at the side of the net just 42 seconds in, **Nolan Caffey** pitched a shot under the bar a minute-and-a-half into the period, and **Mason Kraft** finished a 2-on-1 break with **Luka Shcherbyna** at the 2:21 mark. Spokane got one goal with the extra attacker, a redirect from Armstrong off a Wormald shot with 2:22 to play. Conway earned his fourth win with 34 saves, and Vanek also finished with a goal and an assist, as the Wild earned their third road win of the year. The penalty-killing units were perfect, combining for eight kills.

KNOW YOUR FOE:

Spokane enjoyed a 10-day stoppage, pouncing on the Portland Winterhawks for a 9-2 win last Tuesday in their final outing before the holidays. The Chiefs scored eight goals in the first two periods, and Owen Martin scored two goals in the opening 14 minutes to get the hosts off to a fast start. Mathis Preston scored back-to-back goals eight minutes apart in the second period to add on to a 4-1 lead at the first intermission, while Logan Wormald and Tristen Buckley hit the back of the net to push the lead to seven at the second-period break. Tyson Yaremko and Chase Harrington exchanged goals in the third with the game already out of reach. Preston tied a career high with four points, his ninth career multi-point game, and was named the league's Player of the Week on the basis of last Tuesday's game. The Chiefs have been nothing if not consistent, regardless of where they play, coming out of the mathematical first half at 9-9 at home, and 8-8 on the road.

LET'S CHECK THE LEADERBOARD:

The Wild have several players on league leaderboards as they return home from the holidays. **Josh Toll** has been one of the WHL's best first-year players at making opposing defenses pay, registering 23 assists thus far - no rookie defenseman went into Christmas with more helpers than Toll. Bryce Pickford (Medicine Hat) is the only other defenseman in the league currently leading his team in scoring. **Tobias Tvrznik** was busy in the first half, with his .919 save percentage sitting third in the league. His 672 saves ranked second coming out of the break.

WELCOME TO WENATCHEE:

Wenatchee made a pair of additions at the recess, welcoming Texas native **Riley Bassen** from the NCAA Division I program at Merrimack College - Bassen brings three years of USHL experience to the Wild, playing 149 games for the Cedar Rapids Roughriders and Fargo Force. **Daniel Vaillant** joined the program full-time after two-and-a-half years with Airdrie in the Alberta Elite Hockey League. With a short lineup due to illness coming out of the break, defenseman **Kolton Denich** also made his WHL debut Saturday at Spokane.

WE'RE "SLO" PROUD OF YOU:

Defenseman **Michal Capos** is absent to take part in Slovakia's turn at the World Junior Championships in Minneapolis and St. Paul. Capos is one of eight defensemen and three WHL players on the final roster. The Slovakian contingent dropped its first game at the tournament Thursday, 3-2 against the Swedes before defeating Germany Saturday morning, 4-1. Two more pool-play games remain before an anticipated quarterfinal tilt on Friday against a to-be-determined opponent.

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THIRD TIME'S THE CHARM:

The Wild organization has its eye on a return to the Western Hockey League playoffs in the Wenatchee Valley's third WHL season, after a near miss a year ago. Wenatchee closed out 2024-25 with a 23-36-8-1 record, taking ninth in the 11-team Western Conference, and did so following a second half with razor-thin margins – in their last 30 games, the Wild dropped 14 games by only a one- or two-goal margin, and went to overtime in five of six games at the middle of February. The team that caught them did so after catching fire in their second half – Seattle claimed the final playoff spot with 18 wins after January 10, including wins in six of their last eight games.

LET'S GO CAMPING:

Current Wenatchee player **Blake Vanek** earned a spot on the Ottawa Senators' training camp roster this fall after taking part in the Sens' rookie camp. Another player who started 2024-25 with the Wild, **Kenta Isogai**, earned a training camp slot with the Los Angeles Kings after being picked up by the team's American Hockey League affiliate, the Ontario Reign, late in the summer.

DRAFT DAY:

The Wild landed on the National Hockey League draft board twice in late June, with one incoming Wenatchee player selected alongside an outgoing standout. Forward **Blake Vanek** was taken by the Ottawa Senators in the third round, at 93rd overall, after a memorable Minnesota high school season with the state runner-up Stillwater Ponies. Meanwhile, UConn commit **Brendan Dunphy** was picked in the seventh round at 207th overall by the Florida Panthers. The draft marked the first time since **Zach Benson's** first-round selection in 2023 that a player with Wenatchee ties had been selected in the NHL Draft.

ONE OF A KIND:

One team award winner remains with the Wild for the 2025-26 season after starring for the club a year ago. **Luka Shcherbyna** won a public fan vote to earn Fan Favorite, behind 49 points, the team's leading returning scorer for 2025-26.

THE 700 CLUB:

Head coach **Don Nachbaur** is in his second year with the Wild, reaching the 700-win plateau in the WHL on November 20, 2024 against the Kelowna Rockets. Topping the WHL's all-time wins list is Don Hay, who won 752 games for Kamloops, Tri-City and Vancouver over 19 years, and is serving as associate coach of the Kelowna Rockets this season. Just behind Hay at 742 career wins is Ken Hodge, who spent 20 years as a WHL head coach with the original Edmonton Oil Kings and the Portland Winterhawks. Nachbaur is in his 21st season as a WHL head coach, spending all of that time with teams in Washington state. He became the WHL's longest-tenured coach on November 14, 2025, stepping behind the bench for his 1,412th game.

THE NEW KID(S) IN TOWN:

Last year's extension of NCAA eligibility to Canadian Hockey League players immediately made the WHL the destination of choice for players from the western half of the United States, and the Wild took great advantage of that new talent pool – of the 25 players on the team's opening-day roster, 15 were brand-new to the WHL. Six of those players were from Minnesota alone, four of whom played in the Class AA state final. Two – **Brandon Mickelson** and **Mason Kraft** – played for the state champion Moorhead Spuds, while two others – **Blake Vanek** and **Cal Conway** – suited up for the runner-up Stillwater Ponies. In all, 11 current Wild players hail from the United States.

MILESTONE WATCH:

With this year's influx of new talent, only seven returning players had at least one WHL goal under their belts going into the year, and neither goaltender on the Wild roster had previously appeared in a WHL game. **Luka Shcherbyna's** 95 career points tops the current Wild career list, while **Dawson Seitz** is the only player on the Wenatchee roster with 200 career games under his belt. **Caelan Joudrey** hit the 100-game mark on December 7 at Calgary.

WENATCHEE'S ELEVEN:

11 players with ties to the Wild and ICE organizations began the 2025-26 season on National Hockey League rosters, headlined by **Sam Reinhart**, who led the Florida Panthers to their second straight Stanley Cup last season. All three first-rounders who joined the Wild upon the club's relocation to Wenatchee – **Zach Benson**, **Conor Geekie** and **Matt Savoie** – also started the season on an NHL roster, as did former Wild Junior "A" standouts **Nic Dowd**, **Harrison Scott** and **Devin Cooley**.

AN INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR:

The Wild were represented in in-season international competition in early November as **Boston Tait** won gold at the World Under-17 Hockey Challenge in Truro, Nova Scotia. Tait is in his first full WHL season, and played six games last year with a pair of assists as a Wild affiliate player, and was one of 80 players named to Canada's U17 Program of Excellence camp in July. **Michal Capos** was also selected for international play this season, appearing for Slovakia at the 2026 World Junior Championships in Minnesota.

THEIR STOCK IS RISING:

Three Wild players – **Caelan Joudrey**, **Darian Rolsing** and **Tobias Tvrtznik**, were selected for the NHL Central Scouting preliminary Players to Watch list on October 20. All received "C" ratings, indicating a likely fourth- or fifth-round selection in the 2026 NHL Draft.

DON NACHBAUR



HEAD COACH

The Wenatchee Wild are excited to welcome Don Nachbaur back to the Wild family for his second season as the team's head coach in 2025-26. He came

to Wenatchee after serving the previous three seasons as an American Hockey League assistant coach in the Calgary Flames organization for the Calgary Wranglers & Stockton Heat.

A native of Kitimat, British Columbia, Nachbaur has built an extensive and decorated coaching resume following a 15-year professional playing career. Prior to moving into the pro ranks, he played two seasons in the WHL with the Billings Bighorns, scoring 67 goals and 146 points from 1977 to 1979. He still shares the WHL record with a five-goal playoff game in 1978. Nachbaur was selected by the Hartford Whalers in the third round of the 1979 National Hockey League draft and played in nearly 900 professional contests, including 223 NHL games for the Whalers, Edmonton Oilers and Philadelphia Flyers. He also claimed an AHL Calder Cup in 1988 as a member of the Hershey Bears.

During a 31-year coaching career, Nachbaur has guided teams at the highest levels of the sport, including eight seasons as an assistant in the NHL and AHL, and two years as a head coach in Europe. He is also a proven winner as a Western Hockey League head coach and is especially familiar with the league's U.S. Division, with 20 seasons of experience as a bench boss with the Seattle Thunderbirds, Tri-City Americans and Spokane Chiefs in addition to the Wild. The longest-tenured and third-winningest head coach in WHL history, Nachbaur earned his 700th WHL victory November 20, 2024 at the Kelowna Rockets, and has earned three Dunc McCallum Memorial Trophies as the WHL's Coach of the Year – he is the only coach in Canadian Hockey League history to earn his league's Coach of the Year honors for three different CHL teams. He has also enjoyed international success behind the bench, serving as an assistant coach for Canada at the 2012 World Junior Championships, and winning gold as an assistant coach for the Canadian under-18 team at the 1999 Nations Cup and 2011 Ivan Hlinka Memorial Tournament.

Nachbaur has family ties to the city of Wenatchee and the Wild organization, with son Daniel playing for the Wild in the British Columbia Hockey League in 2015-16 before embarking on a four-year NCAA playing career at UMass-Boston. Don and his wife Kim have two adult children, Sydney and Daniel.
