Wild/ICE All-Time Record vs. Vancouver: 26-17-1-0 - 45<sup>th</sup> regular-season meeting

### IN A NUTSHELL:

The Wild finish the season series with the Giants, and do so on home ice.

### THE SCENE-SETTER:

The newest Wenatchee Wild player earned his first goal in his new uniform, but Burke Hood stood in the way continuously as the Wild tried to battle back at the Vancouver Giants before taking a 2-1 loss Saturday. Kaleb Hartmann earned his first goal in a Giants uniform by sending home a one-timer from the blue line just 5:20 into the game, but with 7:08 to go in the first period, **Caelan Joudrey** found **Levi Benson** in front of the net for a shifty backhand drag, depositing a shot past Hood to tie the game going to the break. The deciding goal came from Jakob Oreskovic on the breakaway three-and-a-half minutes into the second period, depositing a shorthanded opportunity over **Cal Conway's** shoulder and off the roof of the net to put Vancouver ahead 2-1. Wenatchee posted 31 shots in the final two periods, including a 19-2 mark on shots in the third period, but could never tie the game up again. Conway made 18 saves in taking the loss, and the teams combined to finish perfect on five penalty kills. Hood turned away 38 Wild chances to score his 15<sup>th</sup> win of the season.

### KNOW YOUR FOE:

Vancouver had dropped five of six going to the weekend, but turned the trend in its favor Friday with a 4-3 overtime win against the Tri-City Americans. Ryan Lin scored back-to-back goals less than three minutes apart in the first to put the Giants ahead 2-0, and Savin Virk and Lance McCloskey traded goals 44 seconds apart near the midway point of the contest. Jakub Vanecek scored 99 seconds into the third period to halve the lead, and Carter Kingerski's goal at 12:38 tied it up again, but Mathis Preston pocketed the game-winner on the only shot of overtime at the 26-second mark. Lin added an assist to his two markers, while Preston had an assist to go with his goal. Lin has stormed up the WHL scoring leaderboard - with 50 points, he is the Western Conference's top scorer among defensemen and third in the league, and his 20 assists on the power play ranks second overall on the circuit. The Giants are, however, one of five teams in the WHL with a penalty-killing mark under 70 percent. Incredibly, the home team has won all 11 games between the teams since the Winnipeg ICE moved to Wenatchee in the summer of 2023.

### KILLER INSTINCT:

Wenatchee has gone 46-for-52 (88.5 percent) on the penalty kill over the last 14 games, climbing back to the top of the league in that category. The Wild have allowed multiple power play goals only once in that span, with a perfect performance in nine of those games.

### TALKING TRADES:

The club made a trio of moves this past week ahead of Thursday evening's trade deadline, starting with a deal to move Blake Vanek to the Calgary Hitmen for the rights to Lakeville South High School senior Carter Ernst, and a sixth-round pick in the 2029 WHL Prospects Draft. Wenatchee picked up Kelowna forward **Levi Benson** for a pair of draft picks Wednesday evening, but Dawson Seitz was traded to Prince George Thursday afternoon for a 2029 WHL draft pick. The club comes out of the trade deadline with two of its three available 20-year-old slots filled following Seitz's move.

### RHYME TIME / TOLL'S GOALS:

Defenseman **Josh Toll** remains atop the Wenatchee scoring leaderboard, after scoring goals in back-to-back games last Sunday at Portland and Friday against Moose Jaw. His 24 assists before scoring his first goal of the year obliterated the franchise record. He has been a pacesetter for the club over the last nine games, with 10 points in that stretch, including three multi-point efforts.

### ONE MORE TO ONE HUNDRED:

**Luka Shcherbyna** has moved to within a single point of 100 for his WHL career, with 160 of his 162 appearances coming in a Wild uniform. Shcherbyna joined the club ahead of the 2023-24 season, playing in two previous WHL games as an affiliate player for the Spokane Chiefs.

## THIRD TIME'S THE CHARM:

The Wild organization has its eye on a return to the Western Hockey League playoffs in the Wenatchee Valley's third WHL season, after a near miss a year ago. Wenatchee closed out 2024-25 with a 23-36-8-1 record, taking ninth in the 11-team Western Conference, and did so following a second half with razor-thin margins - in their last 30 games, the Wild dropped 14 games by only a one- or two-goal margin, and went to overtime in five of six games at the middle of February. The team that caught them did so after catching fire in their second half - Seattle claimed the final playoff spot with 18 wins after January 10, including wins in six of their last eight games.

## DRAFT DAY:

The Wild landed on the National Hockey League draft board twice in late June, with one incoming Wenatchee player selected alongside an outgoing standout. **Blake Vanek** started the season with the Wild after being taken by the Ottawa Senators in the third round, at 93<sup>rd</sup> overall, following a memorable Minnesota high school season with the state runner-up Stillwater Ponies. Meanwhile, UConn commit **Brendan Dunphy** was picked in the seventh round at 207<sup>th</sup> overall by the Florida Panthers. The draft marked the first time since **Zach Benson's** first-round selection in 2023 that a player with Wenatchee ties had been selected in the NHL Draft.

## ONE OF A KIND:

One team award winner remains with the Wild for the 2025-26 season after starring for the club a year ago. **Luka Shcherbyna** won a public fan vote to earn Fan Favorite, behind 49 points, the team's leading returning scorer for 2025-26.

## THE 700 CLUB:

Head coach **Don Nachbaur** is in his second year with the Wild, reaching the 700-win plateau in the WHL on November 20, 2024 against the Kelowna Rockets. Topping the WHL's all-time wins list is Don Hay, who won 752 games for Kamloops, Tri-City and Vancouver over 19 years, and is serving as associate coach of the Kelowna Rockets this season. Just behind Hay at 742 career wins is Ken Hodge, who spent 20 years as a WHL head coach with the original Edmonton Oil Kings and the Portland Winterhawks. Nachbaur is in his 21<sup>st</sup> season as a WHL head coach, spending all of that time with teams in Washington state. He became the WHL's longest-tenured coach on November 14, 2025, stepping behind the bench for his 1,412<sup>th</sup> game.

## THE NEW KID(S) IN TOWN:

Last year's extension of NCAA eligibility to Canadian Hockey League players immediately made the WHL the destination of choice for players from the western half of the United States, and the Wild took great advantage of that new talent pool - of the 25 players on the team's opening-day roster, 15 were brand-new to the WHL. Six of those players were from Minnesota alone, four of whom played in the Class AA state final. Two - **Brandon Mickelson** and **Mason Kraft** - played for the state champion Moorhead Spuds, while two others - **Blake Vanek** and **Cal Conway** - suited up for the runner-up Stillwater Ponies. In all, 10 current full-time Wild players hail from the U.S.

## MILESTONE WATCH:

With this year's influx of new talent, only seven returning players had at least one WHL goal under their belts going into the year, and neither goaltender on the Wild roster had previously appeared in a WHL game. **Luka Shcherbyna** now sits just one point away from 100 for his WHL career, and reached the 150-game mark in his WHL career on December 12. **Caelan Joudrey** hit the 100-game mark on December 7 at Calgary.

## WENATCHEE'S ELEVEN:

11 players with ties to the Wild and ICE organizations began the 2025-26 season on National Hockey League rosters, headlined by **Sam Reinhart**, who led the Florida Panthers to their second straight Stanley Cup last season. All three first-rounders who joined the Wild upon the club's relocation to Wenatchee - **Zach Benson**, **Conor Geekie** and **Matt Savoie** - also started the season on an NHL roster, as did former Wild Junior "A" standouts **Nic Dowd**, **Harrison Scott** and **Devin Cooley**.

## AN INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR:

The Wild were represented in in-season international competition in early November as **Boston Tait** won gold at the World Under-17 Hockey Challenge in Truro, Nova Scotia. Tait is in his first full WHL season, and played six games last year with a pair of assists as a Wild affiliate player, and was one of 80 players named to Canada's U17 Program of Excellence camp in July. **Michal Capos** was also selected for international play this season, helping the Slovaks reach the quarterfinals at the 2026 World Junior Championships in Minnesota.

## THEIR STOCK IS RISING:

Three Wild players - **Caelan Joudrey**, **Darian Rolsing** and **Tobias Tvrznik**, were selected for the NHL Central Scouting preliminary Players to Watch list on October 20. All received "C" ratings, indicating a likely fourth- or fifth-round selection in the 2026 NHL Draft.

## DON NACHBAUR



### HEAD COACH

The Wenatchee Wild are excited to welcome Don Nachbaur back to the Wild family for his second season as the team's head coach in 2025-26. He came to Wenatchee after serving the previous three seasons as an American Hockey League assistant coach in the Calgary Flames organization for the Calgary Wranglers & Stockton Heat.

A native of Kitimat, British Columbia, Nachbaur has built an extensive and decorated coaching resume following a 15-year professional playing career. Prior to moving into the pro ranks, he played two seasons in the WHL with the Billings Bighorns, scoring 67 goals and 146 points from 1977 to 1979. He still shares the WHL record with a five-goal playoff game in 1978. Nachbaur was selected by the Hartford Whalers in the third round of the 1979 National Hockey League draft and played in nearly 900 professional contests, including 223 NHL games for the Whalers, Edmonton Oilers and Philadelphia Flyers. He also claimed an AHL Calder Cup in 1988 as a member of the Hershey Bears.

During a 31-year coaching career, Nachbaur has guided teams at the highest levels of the sport, including eight seasons as an assistant in the NHL and AHL, and two years as a head coach in Europe. He is also a proven winner as a Western Hockey League head coach and is especially familiar with the league's U.S. Division, with 20 seasons of experience as a bench boss with the Seattle Thunderbirds, Tri-City Americans and Spokane Chiefs in addition to the Wild. The longest-tenured and third-winningest head coach in WHL history, Nachbaur earned his 700th WHL victory November 20, 2024 at the Kelowna Rockets, and has earned three Dunc McCallum Memorial Trophies as the WHL's Coach of the Year - he is the only coach in Canadian Hockey League history to earn his league's Coach of the Year honors for three different CHL teams. He has also enjoyed international success behind the bench, serving as an assistant coach for Canada at the 2012 World Junior Championships, and winning gold as an assistant coach for the Canadian under-18 team at the 1999 Nations Cup and 2011 Ivan Hlinka Memorial Tournament.

Nachbaur has family ties to the city of Wenatchee and the Wild organization, with son Daniel playing for the Wild in the British Columbia Hockey League in 2015-16 before embarking on a four-year NCAA playing career at UMass-Boston. Don and his wife Kim have two adult children, Sydney and Daniel.
