NEWS & NOTES

TONIGHT'S GAME... The Spokane Chiefs have a chance at revenge Sunday against the Wenatchee Wild after dropping Saturday's home contest 3-2. This time the teams will face off in Wenatchee.

LAST GAME... The Chiefs hosted Wenatchee on Saturday night for the first of two straight games against the Wild. The first 2,000 fans and all Rosauers Hat Trick Club members received a special Numerica Piggy Bank commemorating the 2024-25 Spokane Chiefs Western Conference Championship Team. Coco Armstrong was first on the board at 10:59 of the first, scoring his 19th of the season. Nolan Saunderson and Owen Schoettler chipped in the assists. Wenatchee tied the game at 17:08 of the first thanks to Levi Benson before goals from Mason Kraft and Alexandre Andre gave the visitors a 3-1 lead heading to the third. Chase Harrington brought the Chiefs to within one at 8:00 in the final frame. With an assist on the goal, Chiefs' captain Will McIsaac reached 100 career WHL points. Dominik Petr would add the other helper. Despite sporting a 6-on-4 advantage late in the third, the Chiefs could not find the equalizer and this one would finish 3-2 in favor of the Wild. Vieillard made 23 saves with the penalty kill a perfect 2/2. With the goal tonight, Chase Harrington has 4 points (2G, 2A) in the past two games.

CAPTAIN WILL... The Spokane Chiefs named defenseman Will McIsaac the team captain for the remainder of the 2025-26 season. McIsaac becomes the 38th captain in franchise history and takes over for Berkly Catton, who has remained up with the Seattle Kraken this season. McIsaac was drafted by the Chiefs 28th overall in the 2021 WHL Prospects Draft and made his Western Hockey League debut on January 15, 2022 against the Kamloops Blazers. In June of 2024, McIsaac was selected 145th overall by the St. Louis Blues in the NHL Entry Draft. The Vancouver native was the first defenseman taken out of Spokane since Graham Sward was drafted in the fifth round by Nashville in 2022 and became the 27th Spokane blueliner ever selected in the NHL Draft. McIsaac is just the second Chief selected by the Blues, following Maxim Bets in the 1993 draft. In addition, the Chiefs have added forwards Chase Harrington and Logan Wormald to the leadership group as assistant captains. Spokane's full leadership group now consists of Will McIsaac (C), Owen Martin (full-time A), Nathan Mayes (home A), Chase Harrington (home A), Sam Oremba (road A), and Logan Wormald (road A).

BEST IN THE WEST... Chiefs forwards Chase Harrington, Brody Gillespie and Tyus Sparks have been named to Team West for the innaugural WHL Prospects Game presented by Showpass. Scheduled for Wednesday, February 18, the 2026 WHL Prospects Game will pit the most highly touted, NHL Draft-eligible prospects from the WHL's Eastern Conference against those from the WHL's Western Conference in a one-game battle for WHL supremacy in front of hundreds of NHL scouts and thousands of WHL fans. The showcase is the first all-WHL event of its kind since January 19, 2000, when Kelowna hosted the 2000 WHL All-Star Game. All three Chiefs made it to the NHL Central Scouting Service's Midterm Rankings this month, with Harrington ranking 32nd among North American Skaters, Sparks 63rd, and Gillespie 138th.

A GIANT SWAP... The Spokane Chiefs have acquired defenseman Marek Howell (2006) and forward Tyus Sparks (2008), as well as a first-round pick in the 2026 WHL Prospects Draft, from the Vancouver Giants in exchange for forward Mathis Preston (2008) and a conditional second-round pick in 2029. With the acquisition, Spokane now holds two first-round picks in this year's draft.

WORLDWIDE SARKENOV... Spokane Chiefs 19-year-old import forward Assanali Sarkanov and Team Kazakhstan won silver this month at the Division I, Group A U20 World Championships in Slovenia. Kazakhstan finished with nine points in the tournament. Sarkanov wore the "C" for Team Kazakhstan and finished the tournament with five goals and three assists in four games - 12th in tournament scoring. Sarkanov played alongside his younger brother, Alisher, who is in his rookie season with the Prince Albert Raiders.

THE GERMAN GENTLEMAN... Spokane Chiefs' German goaltender Linus Vieillard represented his home country at the 2026 IIHF World Junior Championship, where he logged an .850 SV%. Vieillard, originally selected 57th overall by Spokane in this year's CHL Import Draft, played for Team Germany in his second-straight WJC after posting a 2.66 GAA and a .915 SV% over three games in last year's tournament. So far this season, the Berlin native has a 2.97 GAA and a .892 SV% with a 12-8-1-0 record.

BIG TIME CHIEFS... Seven Chiefs attended NHL training camps this fall, including F Berkly Catton (SEA), F Andrew Cristall (WSH), F Owen Martin (WPG), D Nathan Mayes (TOR), D Will McIsaac (STL), F Assanali Sarkanov (COL) and D Saige Weinstein (COL). Martin was selected 92nd overall by his hometown Winnipeg Jets this summer. Catton was selected by the Kraken eighth-overall at the 2024 NHL Entry Draft — the highest-selected Chief since Pat Falloon in 1991 (2nd overall – SJS). He signed a three-year entry-level contract with Seattle in July 2024. McIsaac was selected 145th overall by the Blues, while Mayes was selected by the Maple Leafs with the 225th pick in the 2024 NHL Entry Draft. Cristall was selected 40th overall by the Washington Capitals in 2023, while Weinstein signed a three-year entry-level contract with the Avalanche in October of that year as an undrafted free agent.

GOLD MEDAL GILLESPIE... Chiefs forward Brody Gillespie was among six WHL skaters that won gold for the United States at the 2025 Hlinka Gretzky Cup this summer. The Americans' 5-3 win over Sweden marked their first tournament championship since 2003 and second win in tournament history. Meanwhile, Chiefs forward Mathis Preston and goaltender Carter Esler were two of 11 WHLers who clinched bronze as Canada shut out Finland 3-0 in the bronze-medal game. Preston ranked second in scoring for Canada and fifth among all skaters with four goals and three assists in five outings, while Esler pitched a 14-save shutout in his one game.

BENCH BOSS BRAD... Spokane Chiefs head coach Brad Lauer will join Team Canada's coaching staff for the 2026 IIHF World Junior Championship in Minneapolis and St. Paul, Minnesota this December. Canada's coaching staff for the tournament is led by London Knights head coach Dale Hunter, who will be joined by associate coach Misha Donskov (London, ON), assistant coaches Lauer and Gardiner MacDougall (Moncton / QMJHL), goaltending coach Dan De Palma (Kamloops / WHL) and video coach Ethan O'Rourke (Kingston / OHL). In his first season with the Chiefs, Lauer led the team to the WHL Championship Series for the first time since 2008 and improved the team to a 45-20-1-2 record from 30-32-5-1 the year before.
